¹²After the exile to Babylon: Jeconiah was the father of Shealtiel, Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel. ¹³Zerubbabel the father of Abihud, Abihud the father of Eliakim. Eliakim the father of Azor, ¹⁴Azor the father of Zadok. Zadok the father of Akim, Akim the father of Elihud. 15 Elihud the father of Eleazar. Eleazar the father of Matthan. Matthan the father of Jacob, ¹⁶and Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah.

¹⁷Thus there were fourteen generations in all from Abraham to David, fourteen from David to the exile to Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the Messiah.
